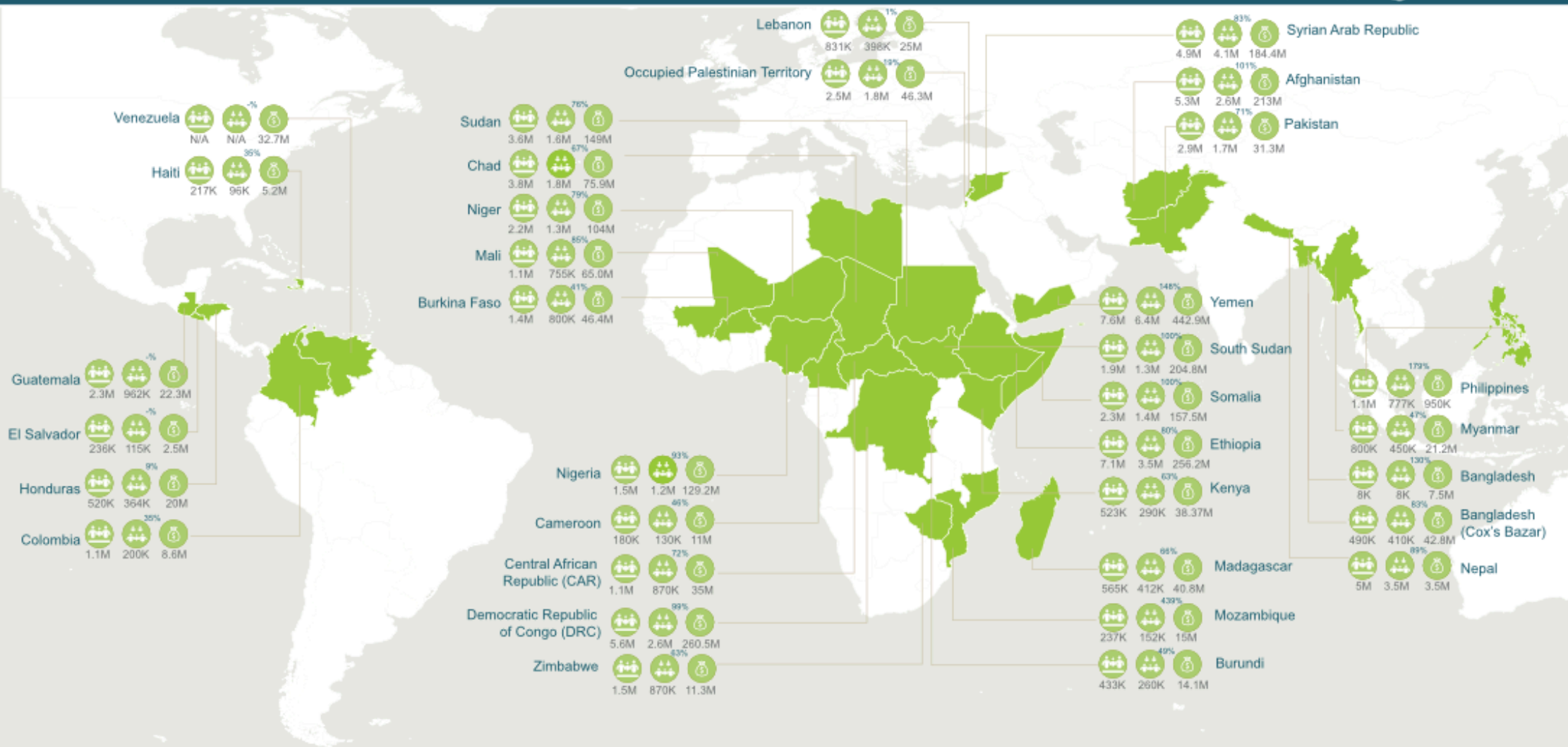

COUNTRY UPDATES

About 73.3 million people were identified as people in need of nutrition interventions in 2021:

In the above countries, the estimates for People in Need (PiN) of nutrition services decreased by about 4.5 million compared to 2020, while the number of people targeted increased by about 1.9 million. In 2021, 73.3 million people, including children aged under five years old and pregnant and lactating women, were identified as needing life-saving nutrition assistance across the 34 countries: country cluster/sector coordination mechanism targeted about 43.9 million out of the total PiN in 2021 for an emergency nutrition response.

A total of 39.7 million children and women were reached through emergency nutrition response services in 2021.

This represents about 90 percent of the Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) targets. Sixteen countries (Afghanistan, Bangladesh (Cox's Bazar), Burundi, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Mali, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, Philippines, Somalia, South Sudan, Whole of Syria, Yemen and Zimbabwe) achieved 75 percent of annual HRP targets, while nine countries (Cameroon, Colombia, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Lebanon, Myanmar and Occupied Palestinian Territory) achieved below 50 percent of their annual target.

COUNTRY UPDATES CONTINUED

About 1.1 billion USD (US Dollars) of funding was received by nutrition partners out of 2.7 billion USD requested for 2021 response.

By the end of 2021 the Nutrition response had received 41 percent of funding requested. Twenty-six countries (Afghanistan, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Colombia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, El Salvador, Ethiopia, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Kenya, Lebanon, Mozambique, Myanmar, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Philippines, Somalia, Sudan, Venezuela, Whole of Syria and Zimbabwe) received less than 50 percent of the declared funding requirements.

On average, the provision of emergency nutrition services in the 23 countries cost about 50 USD per person reached.

All of the following NiE interventions were implemented in 11 countries: treatment of Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) and Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM), Infant and Young Child Feeding in Emergencies (IYCF-E) interventions, Vitamin A supplementation and multiple micronutrient supplementation. Fourteen countries had services for acute malnutrition treatment and IYCF-E, while 20 countries currently implement treatment programmes for SAM and MAM.

COUNTRY CHALLENGES

Countries reporting to the GNC in 2021 faced a number of similar challenges, primarily disruption to health and nutrition services and data collection due to COVID-19 restrictions for the second year in a row: this was reported by 54 percent (18/33) of respondents. The latest wave of COVID-19 had impacted both nutrition service delivery by providers, with the closure of health centres due to low staffing and delays in delivery of supplies, and the service-seeking habits by community members, decreasing admissions to treatment programmes.

Another issue raised by nearly one quarter of countries (8/33) was low availability of recent data due to the disruption of monitoring and delay/cancellation of surveys. This was also attributed to the under-funding of the sector to carry out surveys and evaluations to update nutrition data, affecting the scale-up of interventions; and a lack of information management (IM) capacity, resulting in poor data collection and an underuse of some coordination tools. Weak supply chain and information management systems made it difficult to support quality service delivery.

COVID-19 continued to contribute to the deteriorating socio-economic situation experienced by countries in 2021. This was compounded by natural disasters such as floods, droughts, storms and earthquakes that impeded NiE programming through population displacement and access constraints.

COUNTRY CHALLENGES CONTINUED

Persistent conflict also affected the movement of people and supplies, with several countries reporting a deteriorating security situation in 2021. Some affected populations were experiencing both natural events and insecurity.

The nutrition sector was described as critically underfunded. This led to insufficient actions to prevent malnutrition in fragile areas and inadequate coverage of both prevention and treatment interventions for acute malnutrition. All countries highlighted that there was not enough funding to respond to all affected populations in an adequate manner. The persistence of weak inter-sectoral convergence was attributed to conditional funding across nearly all sectors that has slowed down holistic approaches.

Countries are still reporting an insufficient integrated multisectoral approach with few examples of nutrition, health, food security and WASH packages targeting priority areas (geographic convergence). Staff turnover in clusters and conflicting deadlines and schedules contributed to challenges with inter-sectoral collaboration. There was also low coverage of partners' presence (both local and international) in emergency-prone areas and limited capacity of humanitarian stakeholders to respond to complex emergencies.
